

He then took several courses at Pennsylvania State College and Columbia University. He earned the degrees of Master of Arts and Doctor of Philosophy in the graduate school of education at New York University.

During his career, Dr. Noonan has served at various times as grade teacher, high school teacher, special supervisor, high school principal, supervising principal, college instructor, and institute lecturer. He has been superintendent of the Mahanoy Township Public Schools for the past seventeen years.

Because of his ability and splendid leadership, Dr. Noonan was elected president of the Pennsylvania State Education Association in 1928.
